HOWEVER, we are collecting funds and in-kind building materials in order to build first structures.

Our future facility starts here!

 We have been granted to use a 3 acre parcel of private undeveloped old farm land, which is located at the foot of Cartwright Mountain within the District of Summerland!

The land (zoned partly AI, partly ALR) belongs to the
 Laidlaw family, who lives there, uses the front of the
 property for keeping horses and has generously allowed us
 to use the back part to build up our wildlife rehabilitation
 centre.

We are planning to occupy this unused parcel to build temporary structures and enclosures for various species of wild animals needing care.

It comprises of a small creek and a riparian zone, is partly
wooded with poplars and pine trees, and has a little old barn
on it, providing great natural habitat and giving it some
