Several goose inquiries about the “honkers” made us nearly go bonkers.



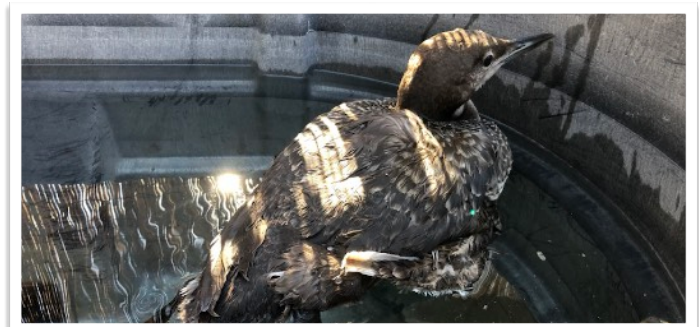
WHY NOT TO feed wild waterfowl?

November - Veterinary partner network expanded with animal clinics in: Kelowna, West Kelowna and Penticton

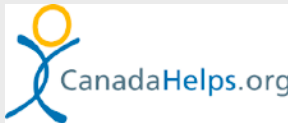
December - Received 2nd community grant for a wildlife facility truck from the Central Okanagan Foundation (COF)
