We did it!!!

We are proud to announce that we have successfully **passed our government inspection** and have been granted our provincial and federal **operating permits!**

Species we are allowed to accept and have the resources available to care for/house this year include: **waterfowl & small mammals** (excluding large carnivores, ungulates and non-natives "schedule B and C" as per BC Wildlife Act).

With that, we opened our doors for patients on June 1st. Here are some of our first animals that came through the past weeks:

How do we admit animals?

- 1) Member of the public, a conservation group or CO sends us a message (Mon-Sun during the daytime)
- 2) We reply within 24hrs, usually we get to messages x_3 /day
- 3) Arrangements are made for: drop-off at one of our partner clinics or a trained volunteer
- 4) Transport to our facility is provided by one of our volunteers

EDUCATION IS KEY

We were invited by the

Upon invitation by the Constable Neil Bruce Middle School, we've also been able to connect to two classes and sharing thoughts about "Our Wild Wild Neighbors".

What if the animal isn't on our permits?

We are able to **stabilize** certain wild animals and **transfer** them to other rehabilitation facilities in our network (e.g. BC Wildlife Park's Rehabilitation Department (Kamloops) or SORCO (Oliver)). This **is helpful** if an animal would otherwise perish during longer-distance transport. Think warming up juveniles, rehydration via injection or first-aid treatment.

Success - our first grant!

We have successfully applied for our first grant! The **Central Okanagan Foundation** provides support to local charities for community projects that align with this private foundation's mission. We will be able to put this grant towards our second shipping container - which will serve as a "Baby Animal Nursery" at our Summerland facility. What a great opportunity! **Thank you board members** for your continued support!
