Goals & Milestones of 2023 - a recap!

May - OK College "Indigenous Women in Trades" students built us an aquatic mammal shed - now insulated, chew-proved and painted for adult and infant beavers

June - Our provincial permit was expanded to include further small mammal species (skunk, marmot, porcupine, chipmunk)

July - Received first 3-year grant by the Central Okanagan Foundation (COF) to include some operational costs of our facility

August - Semi-aquatic mammal compound expanded to new indoor/outdoor beaver pens

October - Seasonal water hookup expanded to all year-round irrigation water for our pools
